## A.A. Liberal Arts: English Specialization Pathway

## **ADVANCE Program Milestones**

- 1. Students must take SDV 100 or SDV 101 in the first semester at NOVA.
- 2. Students must begin Developmental coursework in the first semester in ADVANCE at NOVA.
- 3. Students must take first college-level MTH course and ENG 111 in the semester immediately following the completion of any MTT or ENF courses (excluding summer).
- 4. In the first 30 credits, students must:
  - a. Complete ENG 111 and ENG 112 with a C or better.
  - b. Complete the first college-level MTH course with a C or better.
- 5. Students must complete at least six degree-applicable credits with a C or better each fall and spring semester.
- 6. Students must maintain a 2.5 cumulative GPA.
- 7. Students must contact MasonCW@gmu.edu for BFA application after the completion of ENG 211 and prior to Mason matriculation.
- 8. Students must apply for NOVA graduation and complete their Associate's degree.

BFA Application Requirement: The Creative Writing BFA application requires the submission of a letter of recommendation from a NOVA creative writing faculty member, a writing sample, and an essay. Contact MasonCW@gmu.edu for specifics.

General Note: Students will complete 21 credits of BFA core requirements, 12 credits from one of 3 concentrations, and 12 credits in English department requirements. 300-level courses in English and linguistics teach the foundational principles for a field of study, include courses of broad scope, and provide an introduction to a genre, literary period, or methodology. 400-level courses in English and linguistics provide an in-depth approach to a field of study, a single genre, literary period, or methodology. They include special topics classes and English honors classes. Some 400-level courses require ENGH 305 Dimensions of Writing and Literature as a prerequisite.
