A.A.S. Physical Therapist Assistant ADVANCE Program Milestones

ADVANCE Program will estones

ADVANCE Milestone Requirements: All ADVANCE students must adhere to the following requirements. For Milestones #1-#3, failure to meet these milestones will prevent a student from matriculating to Mason and/or result in termination from ADVANCE. For Milestones #4-#7, failure to meet these milestones may delay matriculation to Mason.

- 1. Students must graduate with the NOVA degree aligned with their ADVANCE academic pathway within 4 years of being admitted into ADVANCE.

 Students are highly encouraged to be continuously enrolled at NOVA/Mason to support progress towards degree completion.
- 2. Students must maintain a minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA at NOVA and must have a minimum 2.5 GPA upon matriculation to Mason.
- 3. Students who wish to enroll at Mason for the fall semester must apply for NOVA spring graduation by March 1 or summer graduation by June 1. Students who wish to enroll at Mason for the spring semester must apply for NOVA fall graduation by October 1.
- 4. Students must begin developmental coursework no later than the first semester in ADVANCE at NOVA.
- 5. Students must take first college-level MTH course and ENG 111 in the semester immediately following the completion of any MDE or EDE courses (excluding summer).
- 6. In the first 30 credits, students must complete ENG 111 and ENG 112 with a C or better.
- 7. Students must complete a college level math course with a C or better no later than one semester before NOVA graduation. Refer to your pathway to select the appropriate MTH course(s).

The A.A.S. Physical Therapist Assistant program has additional requirements for admission, including completion of BIO 145 (or BIO 141 & BIO 142, or NAS 150 if previously completed); HLT 141; and ENG 111 with a B or better. Please view the NOVA catalog for completion admission requirements (http://www.nvcc.edu/catalog/index.html). Admission into this program is not guaranteed, but is required to complete this pathway. Students should meet with a NOVA advisor before joining ADVANCE to help understand the admissions requirements. Students must be program placed in the A.S. Health Sciences while completing pre-requisites for the A.A.S. Physical Therapist Assistant degree.

ADVANCE Program-Specific Requirements:

BAS degrees are designed for adult learners who have some work experience in their field of choice. Further, BAS degrees are considered terminal degrees, which means they may not lead to advanced study in master's degree or doctoral programs.

¹Students who complete ENG 111 after Spring 2024 will earn ENGH elective for ENG 111 and ENGH 101 for ENG 112. Students completing ENG 111 after Spring 2024 must take ENGH 101 at Mason, unless ENG 112 is completed at NOVA. Students may opt to attempt the ENGH 101 waiver by exam. Students should attempt the exam, if possible, before their first term of enrollment at Mason, and no later than the first term. Please note: exam availability is limited to specific dates and delaying the completion of ENGH 101 can delay students' Mason graduation timeline.
