ADVANCE Nursing Program Milestones

1. Students must take SDV 101 in the first semester at NOVA.
2. Students must be admitted to the A.A.S. Nursing degree program at NOVA.
3. Students must begin Developmental coursework in the first semester in ADVANCE at NOVA.
4. Students must take first college-level MTH course and ENG 111 in the semester immediately following the completion of any MTT or ENF courses (excluding summer).
5. Students must complete at least six degree-applicable credits with a C or better each fall and spring semester.
6. Students must apply and be admitted to Mason's Co-Enrollment RN-to-BSN program.
7. Students must complete their Mason Nursing Prerequisites with a grade of C or better by completion of the A.A.S. Nursing program. The Mason Nursing Prerequisites are as follows: Anatomy and Physiology I, Anatomy and Physiology II, Microbiology, Statistics, and Bioethics.
8. Students must maintain a 2.85 GPA and:
 - a. Remain in good standing in the A.A.S. Nursing program at NOVA;
 - b. Complete all courses (Nursing Prerequisites, Mason Core, Nursing Program courses, and electives) with a C or better.
9. Students must apply for NOVA graduation and complete their Associate's degree.
10. Students must take and pass the NCLEX examination upon completion of their A.A.S. Nursing program at NOVA.
11. After completion of their A.A.S. degree, students must complete any remaining Mason Core requirements at Mason.
12. At least 30 credits must be taken in degree status at Mason.

This program has additional requirements for admission. Students must meet with a NOVA Medical Education advisor before signing an ADVANCE agreement and must also apply to the Mason Nursing program before matriculation. Students must be program placed in the A.S. General Studies: Health Sciences Specialization while completing pre-requisites for the A.A.S. Nursing degree.

The Co-enrollment BSN Program (BCE) allows students to begin taking online classes toward a BSN degree while enrolled in the AAS-Nursing program at NOVA. Mason's Co-enrollment nursing classes are online, offered in a seven-week format, and can be taken on a full-time or part-time basis.

Students can apply to the Co-enrollment program as early as their first semester of the AAS-Nursing program. Students can complete the Co-enrollment program one semester after earning their RN license at the earliest, but can take additional time if needed. All nursing prerequisite courses must be complete prior to graduation from the AAS-Nursing program at NOVA. To minimize the time needed to earn the BSN, the Mason Core and elective requirements should be completed prior to starting the Co-enrollment program, but it is not required. After graduation from the AAS-Nursing program, students must complete any remaining Mason Core or elective courses at Mason.
